Order

None present for the petitioner. Shri D.A.Bhambania for the respondents. Heard Shri Bhambania and perused the writ petition.

2. It is not disputed that the father of the petitioner was working on daily wages as a Bore Operator. The father of the petitioner died on 25.2.1991. An application was therefore submitted by the petitioner on 14.2.1992 for giving him appointment on compassionate ground. Shri Bhambania for the respondents submitted that there is no provision in any rule or regulation or resolution of the government to give appointment on compassionate ground to the dependent of an employee working on daily wages who died while in service. In the absence of any such rule, regulation or resolution, the petitioner has no legal right for appointment on compassionate ground.

3. In the result, this writ petition fails and same is dismissed. Rule is discharged. No order as to costs.
