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- 4. Counsel for the State submits that all possible steps shall be taken by the Secretary/as well as the Chairman of the Electricity Board.
- 5. Shri N.K. Pandey, Advocate submits that in spite of an application being made, the Electric Meter has not been changed. Shri Pandey may supply a copy of the application to the authority, which shall be disposed of as early as possible preferably within a month.
- 6. So far as Bilaspur city is concerned, learned counsel Shri Diwakar submits that the for payment of electricity bills, persons have to stand up for five or six hours in open places in this summer season. It is a serious matter. Bill Collecting Counters have been reduced. Some more counters have to be opened taking into consideration the suitable places. The Tuch Tell has devised the method of collecting the bills. Persons should not be allowed to stand in open places for payment of bills and proper

- 8. It is noted that in a village namely Belgahna, electricity supply was not there for about four days and officers of the Board did not reach there for four days. So far as complaints regarding authorities are concerned, they may be lodged in police stations or police chauki concerned. On such complaints being lodged in the police station, the S.H.O. or in-charge officer shall forward the same to the nearest office of Asstt. Engineer or Executive Engineer. The Chief Engineer shall notify the telephone numbers and for villages also, proper arrangements should be made.

every citizen of India to safeguard public property and to abjure violence as enshrined in Article 51A-(i) of the Constitution of India. When the newspapers are highlighting their problems and taking up their causes and most of them in right perspective, there is no occasion for any agitational approach. Those who destroy the public property and create law and order situations regarding supply distribution, they be dealt with strictly in accordance with law, whosoever they may be.

16. The Hon'ble Apex Court while dealing with duties of the people in the case of <u>Chandra Bhuvan Boarding v. State of Mysore</u> reported in AIR 1970 SC 2042 observed that:-

"It is a fallacy to think that under our Constitution there are only rights and no duties. The provisions in Part IV enable the Legislatures to impose various duties on the citizens. The mandate of our Constitution is to build a welfare society and that object may be achieved to the extent the Directive Principles are implemented by the legislation."
