ORAL JUDGMENT:

This revision application is directed against the order passed by the Addl. Civil Judge S.D. at Vasco-da-Gama dated 25th June, 1998 in Regular Civil Suit No.46/1997 dismissing the application filed by the present Applicants who were shown as plaintiffs in the suit for deletion of their names. It appears from the record that the application, similar to the one moved by the present petitioners was moved before the Trial Court came to be rejected by a common order which is impugned in the present revision.

- 2. Others being aggrieved by the common order, filed Civil Revision Applications No.221 and 222/1999. Both these revisions came to be allowed by the learned Single Judge of this Court dated 31st March, 2002. Subsequent to this order, other Civil Revision Applications, being Civil Revision Applications No.69/1999 and 31/2000 were also allowed. Since the order involved in the present revision application is the same order which was involved in all these revision and all those revisions were allowed.
- 3. In this view of the matter and for the reasons stated in the said Orders, the impugned order is quashed and set aside. The application seeking

deletion is allowed. The Revision Petition is allowed, with no order as to costs.
