We have perused the petition purported to have been submitted by one Jagat Bahadur Chauhan. We have also gone through the report which is supported by an affidavit by the Officer-in-charge of Soreng Police Station, West Sikkim.

Upon hearing Mr. N. B. Khatiwada, learned Public Prosecutor, we are satisfied that the petition does not merit admission.

The gravamen of the allegation is that, Manbir Chauhan, the brother of the petitioner was tortured by the local police after he was arrested and was made to be on the floor of the police station in an inconscious condition. The said Manbir Chauhan, according to the petition had sustained multiple external and internal injuries.

It appears from the report submitted by the Officer-in-charge of Soreng Police Station that, as back as on 15.1.2003, Soreng P.S.Case No.1(1) of 2003 was registered against Manbir Chauhan under Sections 341, 324/354 IPC on the basis of a written complaint made by one Raj Kumar Sharma alleging that Manbir Chauhan assaulted three persons including his daughter-in-law in the evening of 14.1.2003. Although the police was in search of him, he was evading arrest and only on 20.8.2003 the patrolling party arrested him at about 5,20 p.m. at Mangsari and took him to Soreng P.S. in vehicle No.SK-04/4388. suspected to have drunk also. As he had injuries on his persons, he was sent to Soreng Primary Health Centre for medical check up on 20.8.2003 itself. Dr. G. K. Cintury of Soreng Primary Health Centre had noticed the following injuries on the person of the said Manbir Chauhan :-

Allegation light allegation, it may be seen that the concerned police officer tortured Manbir Chauhan and made him live on the floor throughout the night is without any basis. On the contrary, the said Manbir Chauhan was sent to Primary Health Centre on 20th itself at about 8.30 p.m. In the last paragraph of the petition, the petitioner has made some allegation about the murder of his brother last year. That has got nothing to do with the present allegation made in respect of Manbir Chauhan. In view of what has been stated above, we do not find any basis to take any further action by this Court on the said petition. The petition accordingly stands disposed of.
