The petitioners have filed this petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking direction against respondent No.1 to pay the regular pay scale and other benefits which are fixed and prescribed for a regular employee of the Department and for arrears.

Vide order dated 27/02/1993 the Court passed an interim order which reads thus:

> "In the meanwhile, if the petitioners are working on daily basis, their services be continued until further orders."

On 01/10/1997 the petitioners had moved an application for issuance of a direction to respondent No.1 to consider the case of the petitioners for regularization in services. The Court vide order dated 01/10/1997 directed the respondents to consider the case of the petitioners for regularization of their services. 10/04/2003 the petitioners are not getting the regular pay scale of a regular employee as prescribed in the order dated 10.04.2003. Thereafter, the petitioners had made a representation on 24.06.2003 before the Additional Managing Director. Upon the representation made by the petitioners the Additional Managing Director has marked that advance pay may be given to the petitioners subject to approval of the competent Authority or on security rates pending for finalization of their case. It is further submitted that after the passing the said order of regularization, on 27.03.2004 the General Manager issued a notice calling upon the petitioners to pay the amount, which has been deposited in the personal account of the petitioners, otherwise the same would be deducted from their salaries.

As the services of the petitioners namely, petitioner No.1 Devendra Singh; petitioner No.2 Himmatpal Gupta; petitioner No.3 Gopal Rao Patnaik; petitioner No.7 Ishwar Prasad Sharma; petitioner No.9 Suresh Kumar Yadav; petitioner No.11 Jagdish Prasad Yadav; and petitioner No.12 Mahendra Singh Thakur have been regularized w.e.f. 10.04.2003, the relief of regularization has been granted. During the pendency of the petition, two of the petitioners namely, petitioner No.5 Sharda Upadhyay and petitioner No.6 Santosh Dubey died and petitioner No.4 Sandeep

Pandey; petitioner No.8 Prem Sirgh Thakur; and petitioner No.10 Ramesh Shukla had left the job.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case and material on record, in the opinion of this Court, the ends of justice would be served if a direction is given to respondent No.1 to forthwith grant regular pay scale to the petitioners and to pay the arrears thereof, as early as possible preferably within a period of three months from today. So far as petitioners 5 & 6, who died during the pendency of the petition, are concerned their heirs may make a detailed representation to the competent authority for payment of dues, if any, and on such representation being made the competent authority shall decide the same within a period of six months from the date of making the representation. So far as petitioners 4, 8 & 10, who had left the job, are concerned, they may also make a detailed representation to the competent authority for payment of dues, if any, and on such representation being made the competent authority shall decide the same within a period of six months from the date of making the representation. Ordered accordingly.
