Heard.

By this petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner has challenged the order dated 29-4-2004 passed in Misc. Civil Appeal No.61/2003 by the Fourth Additional District Judge, Raipur, whereby the appeal filed by the petitioner has been dismissed.

Facts in brief of the case are that the petitioner was working as an Assistant Teacher in the School of respondent No.1. It is stated that on the occasion of her marriage she had taken leave from 26-11-2001 to 19-12-2001. It is further stated that thereafter she could not be able to join her duties in the School but on 20-1-2002 she made an application before respondent No.2 to extend her leave as she was advised for bed rest and also requested that whenever she would join her duties she would submit the medical certificate. The said application was rejected by respondent No.2. It is also submitted that vide order dated 7-6-2002 respondent no.2 terminated the services of the petitioner without giving her proper opportunity of hearing. It is submitted that the petitioner filed an appeal before respondent No.2 on 17-6-2002, which was also rejected.

It is contended that thereafter the petitioner filed a suit alongwith an application under Order 39 Rule 1 and 2 read with Section 151 of the Code

of Civil Procedure for temporary injunction. It is further contended that the trial Court rejected the said application for temporary injunction. It is also contended that aggrieved by the order of the trial Court, the petitioner filed an appeal before the Fourth Additional District Judge, Raipur, under Order 43 Rule 1 of the Code of Civil Procedure, which has also been dismissed vide the impugned order.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that initially the order is bad in law.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the State supported the orders of the courts below.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case and material available on record, both the Courts below have held that prima facie no case for grant of interim injunction has been made out. This Court also considered the matter and is of the view that no case is made out for invoking the extraordinary jurisdiction under Article 227 of the Constitution of India.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner prayed that ends of justice would be met if a direction is given to the trial Court to decide the matter at the earliest.

Prayer appears to be reasonable. Let the suit be decided by the trial Court as early as possible preferably within four months from the date of receipt/production of this order subject to co-operation of the parties.
