

On a mention being made, the case is taken up for hearing.

Heard Shri Anand Kumar Tiwari, counsel for the petitioners.

Shri Sanjay S. Agrawal, Govt. Advocate for the State/respondent No.1.

Shri Kishore Bhaduri, counsel for respondents 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 10.

The petitioners, who are students of under graduation courses namely B. Sc. Agriculture, B. Tech. Dairy Technology and B. Sc. Horticulture, have moved this petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India with a prayer that respondents be directed to allow the petitioners to appear in the 4th and 3rd year of B. Sc. Agriculture Course respectively and allow them to appear in the failed subjects of 2nd and 1st year respectively along with prosecuting studies in the 4th and 3rd year of the B. Sc. Agriculture Course.

At the outset, very frankly learned counsel for the petitioner Mr. Tiwari submitted that the petitioners' case is not covered as per the regulation Annexure-P/1 and they are not entitled for the relief asked for as per regulation 13.7 and 13.8 of the regulations. Their prayer is for sympathetic consideration on the ground of parity and similar treatment looking to the earlier decision taken by the University, respondent No.2, Annexure-P/5, on 30th January 2004

whereby the students were allowed to appear in the examination by relaxing regulation 13.7, 13.8 and 13.9 of the regulations. He further submitted that earlier Agriculture College Raipur, was under the Madhya Pradesh Agriculture University and that University has already amended these regulations, as such relief may be granted to the petitioners.

On the other hand, Mr. Kishore Bhaduri, learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondents 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 10 and Mr. Sanjay S. Agrawal, Govt. Advocate appearing for respondent No.1, submitted that no relaxation can be made in the regulations. Only once relaxation was made which was Arnexure-P/5 looking to the peculiar facts and circumstances of each case of the students and that too as a special case. There is no other instance where such relaxation was ever made.

Perusal of Anenxure-P/5 shows that the University is capable of making relaxation looking to the special case, facts and circumstances of the case and also taking into consideration the consequences of the relaxation, nature of the relaxation sought for and also whether relaxation asked for is going to affect or not the educational excellence.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners may be allowed to make a detailed representation raising
