ORAL JUDGMENT (Per Hardas, J.)

Rule made returnable forthwith. By consent of the learned counsel for the parties, these petitions are taken up for final hearing at the stage of admission.

By these petitions, the petitioner seeks for issuance of a writ of mandamus directing the respondent no.2, Deputy Collector and Sub-Divisional Officer, Panaji, to expeditiously adjudicate upon and dispose of the Appeals No.TNC/REV/APPL/6/2001, TNC/REV/APPL/5/2001, TNC/REV/APPL/8/2001 and TNC/REV/APPL/7/2001, pending before the Deputy Collector and Sub-Divisional Officer. The learned Advocate General representing the respondents, fairly states that the respondent no.2 would decide the appeals within a period of six months from today. According to the learned counsel for the petitioner, on the basis of this statement, the grievance agitated by the petitioner in the present petitions does not survive for consideration. We accept the statement made by the learned Advocate General on behalf of the respondent no.2, that he would decide the appeals within a period of six months from today.

3. The Petitions are accordingly disposed of with

no order as to costs.
