He further submits that for the present, the petitioners may be given opportunity to file a detailed representation raising their grievances. Counsel for the State submits that the petitioners have not submitted individual representations. They may file individual representations which shall be considered on their own merits. Having considered and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, in the opinion of this Court, ends of justice will be served if a direction is given to the petitioners to make individual detailed representations raising their grievances before the competent authority of respondents along with a copy of the petition and this order within a month and on such representations being filed, the competent authority of the respondents shall decide the same on its own merits in accordance with law as early as possible preferably within three months from the date of receipt of the representation. It is made clear that if any grievance still remains, the petitioners may avail the remedy available under the law. With the aforesaid observations, this petition stands disposed of.
