ORAL JUDGMENT

1. Rule. Mr.Desai, learned AGP waives service of

notice of Rule for the respondent State Authorities. With the consent of the learned Counsel appearing for both the sides, the matter is finally heard today.

- 2. The petitioner has preferred the petition for challenging the valuation made ultimately by the District Valuation Committee and consequently the petitioner is called upon to make the payment of the premium as per the valuation made.
- 3. Upon hearing the learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner as well as the learned Assistant Government Pleader, it appears that there is no dispute on the point that the hearing has not petitioner before been aiven to the the finalisation of the valuation of the land question. This Court had an occasion to consider the matter on the aspects of following of the principles of natural justice at the time valuation of the land be when the is to finalized for fixation of the amount of premium per Section 43 of the Act, in case of "Bharatbhai Kantilal Jethwa v. State of Gujarat reported in 2006(6) GLH, 303 and and Others", as per the view taken by the Coordinate Bench of this Court, the principles of natural justice is required to be followed to the extent of giving opportunity of hearing to the person concerned, while fixing the amount of premium.

- 4. Mr. Desai, learned AGP is not in a position to dispute the proposition laid down by this Court in the above referred decision and he further submitted that the State Government has not carried the matter before the higher forum.
- 5. Under the above circumstances. as opportunity of hearing has not been given to the petitioner, the impugned decision for fixation of the valuation and consequential action for calling upon the petitioners to pay the premium can be said as in breach of the principles of natural justice. However, in view of the above this referred decision of Court in case "Bharatbhai Kantilal Jethwa" (supra), the opportunity of hearing shall be required to be given to the petitioner before the District Valuation Committee, which has ultimately to finalize the valuation since the amount of premium in the present case is not exceeding Rs.50 lacs.
- 6. Under the above circumstances, the impugned orders are quashed and set aside on the ground of breach of principles of natural justice and it is further directed that the petitioners shall be given opportunity of hearing before the District Valuation Committee and at that stage, the petitioner shall be at liberty to put forward their case on the aspects of valuation of the land in question, including by production

of the authenticated records and the District Valuation Committee shall take appropriate decision in accordance with law, preferably within a period of three months from the date of receipt of the order of this Court and till the decision is communicated to the petitioner by R.P.A.D. post, status quo shall continue to remain in operation.

7. The petition is allowed to the aforesaid extent. Rule is made absolute accordingly. Considering the facts and circumstances, there shall be no order as to costs. D.S. permitted.
