Learned counsel for the parties have come to terms and submit that this petition can be disposed of as settled, without issuing any specific direction herein, except issuing a direction to the learned trial Court seized of the suit to ensure that the suit is disposed of very very expeditiously and in any event by 31st October, 2006.

Based upon the aforesaid agreement, this petition is disposed of. Learned Civil Judge (Jr. Division), Arki, in whose Court the Civil Suit between the parties is pending for disposal is directed to ensure that the same is disposed of very very expeditiously and in any event by 31st October, 2006. All possible steps shall be taken by the parties to the suit also to ensure its disposal before that date. If the learned Presiding Officer finds that any party is not cooperating, he shall adopt all possible measures to ensure the cooperation of that party.

Even though there is an order of injunction granted by the learned trial Court

against the petitioners-defendants, I direct that the petitioners shall not raise any construction. In other words, status quo as existing on date shall be maintained by the petitioners.

The petition is disposed of.
