The Rent Controller and the Appellate Authority have returned a concurrent finding that the deceased landlord alongwith his family members, numbering 10, had been in occupation of two rooms accommodation in a Wakf Board building, as a tenant. The landlord categorically stated that the accommodation was not enough for himself and his family members and that one room, out of the two rooms accommodation, occupied by him was damp. Looking to this concurrent finding, which is based on proper appreciation of evidence, I do not think that the order of eviction calls for any interference. Therefore, the Revision Petition is dismissed.
