This writ petition is directed against the award of the Labour Court, Shimla, passed in Reference No.114 of 2000 dated 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2006. A reference was made by the State Government to the Labour Court in the following terms:

"Whether the action of the management of M/S Mount Everest Mineral Water Ltd., Dhaula Kuna, Tehsil Paonta, District Sirmaur, H.P. in accepting the

resignation of Sh. Dwarka Prashad Kukreti without

full and final settlement of his dues, is legal and

justified. If not, to what relief of service benefits and

amount of compensation, Sh.Dwarka Prasad Kukreti

is entitled."

The Labour Court on appraisal of the evidence has come

to the conclusion that the petitioner had voluntarily submitted his

resignation and had not rejoined his duty and, therefore, his services

cannot be said to have been terminated by the Company. This finding

of the Labour Court is a pure finding of fact and based on the

evidence led before it. The same calls for no interference in the

exercise of extraordinary writ jurisdiction. The writ petition is

dismissed. No costs.
