


The State has filed a preliminary objection as to the maintainability of the writ petition. The State correctly points out that on the last occasion the learned counsel for the petitioner incorrectly submitted on behalf of the petitioner that she would be over age in May, 2008. The Annexure R-1 to the objection shows that for Government servants like writ petitioner the maximum age limit shall be relaxed upto 40 and the writ petitioner is only 34.
