## ORAL ORDER

(Passed on 30th day of September, 2008)

- 1. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the land in dispute belongs to the State Government. He further submits that the petitioner, being a member of Scheduled Tribe, is entitled to grant of certain land. On enquiry by the authorities, initially it was found that the land in dispute is available and suitable for grant of patta to the petitioner. Subsequently, further enquiry was made but till date, no action has been taken. He seeks liberty to approach the respondents for relief.
- 2. Be that as it may, without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, liberty is reserved to the petitioner to make appropriate application before the Collector, Mahasamund, in turn, the Collector, Mahasamund shall consider and decide the application in accordance with law, within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of the representation. Further, in the event it is found that the case for grant of patta is still pending consideration, the same may be considered and decided as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.
- In view of the foregoing, according to learned counsel appearing for the 3. petitioner, nothing remains for adjudication.
- 4. Accordingly, the petition stands disposed of. No order asto costs.
