**This Court made the following:**

**ORDER:-**

This Writ Petition is filed for a Writ of Mandamus to declare the inaction of respondents 1 to 3 on the representation made by the petitioner for transfer of respondent No.4 from Nellore District to any other District, as illegal and arbitrary.

On the petitioner's private complaint given before the jurisdictional Magistrate, the case was referred under Section 156(3) Cr.P.C. to respondent No.4, who registered Crime No.116 of 2007 on 17-9-2007. The petitioner alleged that in collusion with his adversaries, respondent No.4 is not investigating the case properly, but is harassing him.

The learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home, on instructions, stated that respondent No.4 is not the investigating officer, but the Sub-Divisional Police Officer, Gudur, is entrusted with the investigation in Crime No.116 of 2007 of Podalakur Police Station. Therefore, the grievance of the petitioner that respondent No.4 shall be transferred from Nellore District appears to be illusory. Though the petitioner made several allegations against respondent No.4, they are not substantiated by filing any material. I am, therefore, not inclined to accept the allegations made by the petitioner against respondent No.4.

For the above-mentioned reasons, the Writ Petition is dismissed.
