the State and the Accountant General.

The grievance of the petitioner is that benefit of first and second assured career progression (A.C.P.) has not been given to the petitioner. Besides the above, he has not been paid the arrears of salary admissible to him w.e.f. 01.01.1996 as also the provident fund dues has also not been paid in full.

Learned counsel appearing for the State submits that in case petitioner files a fresh representation stating the specific claims said to be the outstanding, the same would be considered without delay as per law.

In the above circumstances, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that for expeditious disposal of the grievances, the petitioner proposes to file a representation before the respondent no.4 giving specific details of the claims.

In this view of the matter, in case such

representation along with the certified copy of the present order is filed by the petitioner within a period of four weeks from today, the above respondent shall consider the grievances of the petitioner in accordance with law expeditiously preferably within a period of four months on receipt of such representation so that the claims raised by the petitioner in the representation could be redressed without further delay.

The writ application is disposed of with the above observations/directions.
