
Heard on admission.

Petitioner Smt. Manorama Ghosh Tapaswi has filed this petition for initiation of proceedings of contempt against respondent Shri O.P. Tiwari arrayed as Incharge Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Bilaspur .

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the respondent has not decided the representation of the petitioner within a period of two weeks, which was filed by her on 13.04.2009.

A perusal of the order dated 17.04.2009 would show that the counsel appearing on behalf of the Corporation had submitted that the pending representation, as stated by the petitioner, shall be considered and decided in accordance with law within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of the said order.

On such submission, learned counsel for the petitioner stated that nothing survives in the matter for adjudication and the writ petition was accordingly disposed of.



I do not find any direction issued from the Court side, which in fact was to be performed by the respondents, failing which, they shall be liable for contempt of the Court's order.

In view of the above, I do find any substance in the petition.

The petition is liable to be dismissed and is accordingly dismissed at the motion stage itself.
