JUDGMENT

The petitioner was selected through the P.S.C for appointment as Tutor in the Social and Preventive Medicine in the Government Homoeopathic Medical College Department. She was appointed in a leave vacancy in Thiruvananthapuram Homoeo Medical College. At that point of time, she had filed W.P.(C).No.9536/2008 seeking for a direction to post her at Calicut Homoeo Medical College.

2. It appears that the petitioner was not able to attend duties due to her ailments and the ailments of her only child. Exts.P2 and P3 are produced in support of the above contention. The petitioner was proceeded against by the competent authority and Ext.P4 is the memo of charges issued to her. Finally, by Ext.P5 order, the Principal and Controlling Officer terminated the probation of the petitioner under Rule 19 (a) Part II of K.S. & S.S.R. Challenging the same, she has filed Ext.P7 before the Government. It is prayed that the said appeal may be directed to be disposed of within a time frame.

3. There will be a direction to the first respondent to take a decision on Ext.P7 after hearing the petitioner within a period of three months from the date of production of a copy of this judgment.

The writ petition is disposed of as above. No costs.
