**ORDER:** (per GM, J)

This writ petition is filed seeking a writ of certiorari calling for the records relating to the common order dated 09.09.2008 passed in O.A.No.4826 of 2008 and batch by the Andhra Pradesh Administrative Tribunal, Hyderabad and for quashing the same.

2. O.A.No.4826 of 2008 was filed seeking to quash the Government Memo dated 05.06.2008 and its consequential proceedings dated 30.06.2008 of the Director of State Audit and set aside the same to the extent of repatriation of the petitioner from Zone-II to Zone-I. The Tribunal clubbed the said O.A. with the other O.As filed by the applicants therein, who were appointed on compassionate grounds, but the petitioner was appointed on the ground of medical invalidation of his father. The Tribunal, by common order dated 09.09.2008, allowed all the O.As and set aside the respective impugned orders to the extent of repatriating the applicants from the place of appointment, in view of G.O.Ms.No.70 dated 11.02.2008, according to which, the dependents of the Government employees can be considered for compassionate appointments at local area. Therefore, the said G.O., does not apply to the case of the petitioner as he was appointed on medical invalidation of his father and the Tribunal ought not to have clubbed the impugned O.A. along with the batch.

3. Accordingly, the Writ Petition is allowed and the impugned order in respect of the petitioner in O.A.No.4826 of 2008 is set aside. The matter is remanded to the Tribunal for fresh disposal in accordance with law. No costs.
