J U D G M E N T

The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the grievance projected in this Writ Petition has already been sought to be redressed by the petitioner by resorting to the statutory remedy by way of Ext.P3 appeal, which is stated as pending consideration before the second respondent. It is stated that the petitioner has also filed Ext.P4 petition for stay along with the statutory appeal.

2. Heard the learned Government Pleader as well.

Considering the facts and circumstances, the second respondent is directed to consider and pass appropriate orders on Ext.P3 appeal in accordance with law, as expeditiously as possible, of course, after giving an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner within one month from the date of receipt of a copy of this judgment. It is made clear that till appropriate orders are passed on Ext.P4 petition for stay all further coercive steps stated as being taken against the petitioner shall be kept in abeyance.

The Writ Petition is disposed of.
