Heard the learned Special Government Pleader, representing the learned Advocate General, for the appellants and Sri Addepalli Suryanarayana, learned counsel for the respondents 1 and 2.

2. Since both the appeals are inter-related, they are being disposed of by this common judgment.

The learned Special Government Pleader as well as the learned counsel for the respondents 1 and 2 brought to the notice of this Court that the Superintending Engineer (A/c), NSLBC O&M Circle, Miryalaguda, addressed a letter No.DB/ATO-4/1574/522CE/2, IRRIGATION & C.A.D.(P.W.) DEPARTMENT, Government of Andhra Pradesh, dated 31-8-2010, to the Chief Engineer, N.S. Project, Hill Colony, submitting that the identified excess land of Ac.0-15 gts., in Survey No.149/1 of N.S.P. Camp Colony, Kodad, has been handed over to Sri Yerra Srinivasa Rao and others on 30-8-2010. It could be further seen from the appended

proceedings to the said letter relating to the delivery of the property that while delivering the possession it was agreed that three quarters, which are situate in the said land, would be removed at the earliest.

4. Both the learned counsel represented that in view of the said proceedings initiated by the Government of Andhra Pradesh and the undertaking appended thereto, no further cause of action survives and nothing remains for adjudication in these appeals.

5. Accordingly, both the letter patent appeal and the writ appeal are disposed of.
