## RAM CHAND GUPTA, J.(Oral)

The present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.52, dated 16.5.2010, under Sections 148, 307, 452, 324, 323, 149 IPC, registered at Police Station City Hoshiarpur.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have gone through the whole record carefully.

As per allegations on 11.5.2010 at about 2.30 p.m., Kulwinder Singh, complainant alongwith his brother Jasvir Singh and Yogesh Kumar @ Vicky were taking tea at tea-stall near Government College chowk, when Deepak Kumar @ Kaka armed with khanda, Kuldeep Singh armed with kirpan, Jaspal Pali armed with khanda, Gama armed with datar, Jaggi, the present petitioner, armed with kirpan, Jaspreet Singh @ Channa armed with khanda alongwith 5/6 unidentified persons came on their motor-cycles and after entering into the shop inflicted injuries to Jasvir Singh and Yogesh Kumar. As many as 17 injuries were received by Jasvir Singh. He also lost sight of his one eye.

Hence, it is not such a case in which extraordinary relief of anticipatory bail should be granted to the petitioner-accused.

Hence, in view of these facts, and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the present petition filed by petitioner-
