(2) By means of this petition, moved under section 482 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, (for short Cr.P.C), the petitioners have sought the direction that the petitioners be released on bail on personal bonds in connection with F.I.R 40 of 2009, relating to offence punishable under section 307 I.P.C., added to offences punishable under section 147, 148, 149, 323, 324, 504, 506 I.P.C., Police station Kichha, District Udham Singh Nagar..

(3) Learned counsel for the parties have stated that they have no objection if this petition is disposed by directing the trial court to decide the bail application of the petitioners without unreasonable delay, in respect of offence punishable under section 308 I.P.C., as they have already been enlarged on bail in connection with the aforesaid crime relating to offences punishable under section 147, 148, 149, 323, 324, 504, 506 I.P.C.

(4) In the above circumstances, the petition under section 482 of Cr.P.C., is disposed of

with the direction that on petitioners Jaswant Singh, Sucha Singh and Swarna Singh surrendering before the court concerned, their bail application shall be heard and disposed of without unreasonable delay, relating to offence punishable under section 308 I.P.C., keeping in mind that they are already released on bail relating to offences punishable under section 147, 148, 149, 323, 324, 504, 506, I.P.C., and the fact that the injured persons have no objection to it.
