ORDER

- Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that, at this stage, the petitioner does not want to press the relief clause 10.1. However, since the Collector, Raigarh, has not considered the representation of the petitioner dated 3/9.2.2011 (Annexure P-10) till date and are proceeding to initiate action for acquiring the land in dispute, thus, the Collector may be directed to consider his representation and take a decision before the acquisition proceeding is initiated.
