PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner is arrayed as A2 and he prayed for grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C., for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 447, 341, 294(b), 323 and 506 (ii) I.P.C. in Crime No.142 of 2011 on the file of the respondent police and hence, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the State.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit in his argument that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence. He would further submit in his argument that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and hence, he prays for anticipatory bail in favour of the petitioner.

4.The learned Additional Public Prosecutor (Criminal Side) would submit in his argument that no one sustained injury in the alleged occurrence.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, I could see that no one sustained injury in the alleged occurrence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the petitioner is directed to be



released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thirumangalam, and on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thirumangalam and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate daily at 10.30 a.m. for a period of four weeks. The petitioner shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. Scrupulously.

6.The petitioner shall appear before the Magistrate concerned within a period of 15 days, failing which, the anticipatory bail granted shall stand automatically cancelled.
