**ORDER :**

This writ petition is filed with the prayer, which reads as under :

“to issue a writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents particularly the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent in directing the petitioners to compromise with the accused in Crime No.187/2008 on the file of the Tanuku Police Station and settle the disputes and also forcing the petitioners to appear before the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent police station frequently even without registering any case against the petitioners as illegal, unjust, arbitrary and without authority of law and against statutory provisions and consequently direct the respondents particularly the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent not to harass and direct the petitioners to compromise with the accused in Crime No.187/2008 on the file of Tanuku Police Station.”

It is the case of petitioners that though they lodged a complaint in Crime No.187/2008, instead of investigating into it, the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent-Station House Officer is insisting them to compromise with the accused and they were also called to the Police Station.

A detailed counter affidavit is filed by the Sub-Inspector of Police, Attili Police Station, West Godavari

District. In the counter, while denying the allegations made by the petitioners, it is stated that there is no necessity for pressing the petitioners to compromise with the accused, and they also denied summoning of petitioners to the Police Station.

In view of the above said statement made in the counter, the learned counsel for petitioners requests for disposal of writ petition by recording the aforesaid statement made in the counter.

As it is stated that the respondents have never insisted the petitioners to compromise with the accused and that they were never summoned to the Police Station, placing on record such statement, the writ petition is closed. No costs.
