This is a petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking quashing of the

FIR No.952/2006 under Sections 498A/406/34 IPC P.S. Malviya Nagar

registered on the complaint of respondent No.2.

Ground for seeking quashing is that the FIR is the result of

matrimonial discord between the petitioners and respondent No.2 which

has now been amicably settled and now there is no dispute left between

them.

Petitioners are present. They are identified by their counsel Raj

Kumar, Advocate. Respondent No.2 is present. She is identified by IO SI

Amit Chaudhary, P.S. Malviya Nagar.

Petitioner No.1 and respondent No.2 confirm that they have

amicably settled the matter through mediation and petitioner No.1 and

respondent No.2 have obtained consent divorce. As per the terms of

settlement, petitioner No.1 agreed to pay ₹1,80,000/- to respondent No.2,

out of which ₹1,50,000/- have already been paid and balance ₹30,000/- is

paid today vide a pay order No.358283 dated 30.11.2010 for ₹30,000/- in

favour of respondent No.2 drawn on Syndicate Bank, International

Business Branch, Connaught Circus.

Respondent No.2 submits that she has amicably settled the matter

with petitioner No.1 of her own accord, without any inducement or

pressure from any corner. In terms of settlement, she has already

received ₹1,50,000/- and today balance ₹30,000/- has been received by

her vide a Pay Order No.358283 dated 30.11.2010 for ₹30,000/- drawn on

Syndicate Bank, International Business Branch, Connaught Circus and now

there is no dispute left between them and submits that she does not want

any action against the petitioners on her complaint and she has no

objection if the FIR is quashed.

Learned Mr. R.N. Vats, APP appearing on behalf of the State submits

that in view of the settlement arrived at between the parties, State has

no objection in case the FIR and the proceedings emanating therefrom are

quashed.

Since the parties have arrived at an amicable settlement through

mediation and obtained the consent divorce, I feel that no useful purpose

shall be served in keeping the FIR and the proceedings arising out of the

same alive. Therefore, the FIR No.952/2006 P.S. Malviya Nagar and

proceedings arising out of the same are quashed.

Parties shall remain bound by the terms of the settlement.

Petition stands disposed of.
