This is a joint petition filed by the complainant/petitioner No. 2 and the accused/petitioner No. 1 seeking quashing of FIR No. 118/2008 under Sections 406/498A/34 IPC registered at P.S. Tilak Nagar on the complaint of the petitioner No. 2.

Petitioners are present. They are identified by their counsel Sh. Vinod Kumar, Advocate as well as IO SI Raghubir Singh, P.S. Tilak Nagar.

Petitioners are seeking quashing of FIR on the ground that they have arrived at an amicable settlement and now, there is no dispute left between them. They submit that they have entered into settlement of their own accord without any inducement or threat from any corner and pursuant to the settlement, petitioner No. 1 has agreed to pay Rs. 1 Lakh to the petitioner No. 2 in full and final settlement of her claim for "Streedhan" and past and future maintenance. Parties state that they have already applied for mutual consent divorce and divorce decree has been passed by the Matrimonial Court.

Petitioner No. 2 states that FIR was the result of matrimonial discord which has now been amicably settled. She has already received a sum of Rs.

75,000/- out of the settlement amount and balance Rs. 25,000/- is paid in cash today to her by the petitioner No. 1. She submits that now, there is no dispute left between the petitioners. Consequently, she does not want any

action on her FIR and she has no objection if the FIR is quashed.

Learned APP appearing for the State submits that in view of the compromise arrived at between the petitioners, State has no objection if the instant FIR as well the consequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed.

Since the parties have amicably resolved their matter in dispute and now, there is no dispute left, I am of the view that no useful purpose shall be served by keeping the instant FIR alive. Accordingly, FIR No. 118/2008 under Sections 406/498A/34 IPC registered at P.S. Tilak Nagar and the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are quashed.

Petition stands disposed of.
