

THE HON'BLE SRI JUSTICE G. CHANDRAIAH

WRIT PETITION No. 13092 of 2012

ORDER:

Alleging inaction on the part of the respondent in considering the representation dated 19.04.2012, this writ petition is filed.

Briefly, the facts of the case are:

The petitioner is the owner of the land, in an extent of 900 Sq.yards in Sy.No.145 & 146, by virtue of a registered Gift Deed No.1179 of 2008, executed by her husband on 20.06.2008. It is stated that her husband obtained permission for construction of compound wall from the Gram Panchayat, Korutla, on 21.01.1987, by paying requisite fee, but however, he couldn't construct the wall due to personal reasons. The petitioner approached the respondent on 21.03.2012, seeking permission for construction of compound wall, and also paid an amount of Rs.11,800/- towards building permission fee on 29.03.2012. The respondent refused to accord permission and asked the petitioner to apply for land regularization. The petitioner submitted a representation to the respondent on 19.04.2012 for the purpose of land regularization, duly enclosing certain documents, and sought to intimate the fee to be paid for land regularization. Alleging inaction on the part of the respondent, this petition is filed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner made a representation on 19.04.2012 enclosing relevant documents pertaining to the land, seeking to intimate her the fee to be paid for land regularization, but the respondent has not acted upon her representation.

Learned Standing Counsel for the respondent-Corporation submits that the respondent may be directed to consider the application dated 19.04.2012 submitted by

the petitioner, and pass appropriate orders, in accordance with law.

Having regard to the submission made by both the counsel, without going into merits of the case, this writ petition is disposed of, directing the respondent to consider the application dated 19.04.2012 filed by the petitioner and pass appropriate orders, in accordance with law. Consequently, WPMPs, if any, filed along with this writ petition shall stand automatically disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.
