This petition has arisen out of the order dated 28.02.1996 passed by the Civil Judge (Senior Division), Kapurthala, dismissing the application filed by the petitioners for restitution of the suit property.

A civil suit filed by Jaspal Kaur against the petitioners and Ranjit Singh was decreed on 03.10.1988. Thereafter, in execution filed by said Jaspal Kaur-decree holder, the property of the petitioners was put to auction and the same was purchased by Puran Singh and Bhajan Singh-respondent Nos. 2 and 3 herein. Sale certificate was also issued in their favour. Later on, the petitioners filed an application for setting aside the aforesaid exparte decree (after the property was auctioned) which was allowed on 08.08.1992

and ultimately, suit filed by Jaspal Kaur was dismissed. Now the petitioners

have sought restitution of the suit property, which has already been auctioned.

The trial Court, while dismissing the application, has held that

respondent Nos.2 and 3 (Puran Singh and Bhajan Singh) having purchased

the property through Court auction, are the bonafide purchasers for

consideration and the setting aside of the exparte judgment and ultimate

dismissal of the main suit filed by Jaspal Kaur against the petitioners and

Ranjit Singh does not affect their rights, which has accrued to them pursuant

to the sale certificate dated 11.06.1991.

Having examined the impugned order, no illegality, much less

irregularity has been detected therein, warranting interference by this Court.

No merits.

Dismissed.
