BY THE COURT

(1) By this writ petition, the petitioner has only pressed the grievance with regard to her posting at Government Girls' School, Bhopawas, Jaipur.

(2) Submission of the counsel for the petitioner is that although no policy has been framed by the respondents regarding posting of Teacher Grade-II but they are giving choice posting to the meritorious candidates at some places whereas the merit position is being ignored at other places. Counsel further submits that in SBCWP No.3224/2012 Anita Kumari Meena V. State of Rajasthan and others decided on 6.3.2012, this Court passed the following order:

“Since it is a matter of posting, a policy decision on the aforesaid has to be taken by the respondents only. Looking to the aforesaid, the petitioner is directed to make a detailed representation to the respondents within a period of seven days from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. The respondents are then expected to look into the matter and see that postings of all the candidates are given without vice of arbitrariness and a policy decision be taken to avoid such an event. They are expected to take decision at the earliest. The petitioner may, however, join the post at the place where she is posted. It will, however, not effect her representation, rather respondents are expected to consider the representation and take a policy decision so that no discrimination remains in their action. The exercise aforesaid may be undertaken within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of the

representation and a policy decision taken thereupon be informed to the petitioner with a copy to this this Court to see its fairness.

With the aforesaid, the writ petition is disposed of."

(3) This writ petition is disposed of with the observation that the petitioner would be entitled to the same relief, on submission of the representation within the same stipulated period, as has been granted in the case of Anita Kumari Meena V. State of Rajasthan and others (supra).
