Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned counsel for the State.

The petitioner is mother-in-law of the deceased of the case registered under Sections 304B/34 of the IPC. The informant's daughter Kanchan Devi was married with son of the petitioner. It has been alleged that she was being ill-treated and tortured by all her in-laws in connection with additional demand of dowry. After she was burn then she was carried to P.M.C.H. but for better treatment she was taken to Appolo Burn Hospital where she died.

Learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is mother-in-law of the deceased and was not associated with the day-to-day activities.

The petitioner is living separately from the deceased and her son from before. The petitioner is not responsible for causing death.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the petitioner Usha Devi is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Jamui in connection with Jhajha P.S. Case No. 61 of 2013.
