Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and the
informant.

Petitioners are apprehending their arrest in a
complaint case in which cognizance has been taken for the
offence under Sections 420, 120(B) of the Penal Code on the
allegation that blank paper with signature furnished by the
complainant to the Karmchari has been used by Petitioner No.
1 for taking some advantage in a pending litigation regarding
mutation of the lands in question. Petitioner No. 2 is said to
have used another blank paper over which signatures were
obtained from the villagers on the pretext that they are to be
provided with hand-pumps etc. but the paper was used in the
same litigation. Counsel for the petitioners states that the
litigation in which the two blank papers were used is pending
in the High Court by way of a writ petition filed by the wife of

the complainant and one another Daya Devi who is the mother of Petitioner No. 2.

As the parties are connected with each other, I direct the petitioners (named above) to surrender in the court below within four weeks from the date of receipt/production of a copy of this order in the court below and thereafter be admitted to the privilege of bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Nawadah in connection with Trial No. 2397 of 2011, arising out of Complaint Case No. C-844 of 2011, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C. Any observation made in this order will not affect the pending writ petition.
