

Heard Mr. M.J. Quadir, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. B.J. Ghosh, learned State counsel appearing for the respondent Nos.1 to 3.

As agreed to by the learned counsel appearing for the parties, the writ petition is taken up for disposal at the motion stage itself.

The grievance of the petitioner in the present petition is that though he lodged an FIR on 5th September, 2009 in Sadar Police Station, Nagaon, the same has not been registered, for which the petitioner also filed an application before the Superintendent of Police on 10th August, 2011 ventilating his grievance of non registration of the FIR. It is the case of the petitioner that the Superintendent of Police, despite receipt of the said application has not taken any further steps.

Mr. Quadir, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the writ petition may be disposed of directing the Superintendent of Police, Nagaon to look into the grievance of the petitioner and to take appropriate follow up action.

Mr. Ghosh, learned State counsel submits that if the petitioner has approached the Superintendent of Police, Nagaon by way of the aforesaid application dated 10th August, 2011, the same shall receive due consideration from the Superintendent of Police, Nagaon.

Having regard to the aforesaid position, the writ petition is disposed of directing the Superintendent of Police, Nagaon to pass necessary order on the application stated to be filed by the petitioner on 10th August, 2011, provided such application has in fact been filed. The said exercise is directed to be completed within a period of 1(one) month from the date of production of the certified copy of the order passed today alongwith the copy of the writ petition and the annexures appended thereto by the petitioner before the Superintendent of Police, Nagaon.

The writ petition is accordingly disposed of. No costs.
