Before counsel for the petitioner argues in detail about the case, it is submitted by the counsel for opposite party nos. 3 and 4 that today they have brought a cheque of Rs.5,00,000/- of Bank of India, Lalpur Branch, Ranchi, dated 26th June, 2013 and they are offering this cheque to the counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner.

2. This cheque is received by the counsel for the petitioner, who has acknowledged the receipt of the cheque.

4. Looking to the aforesaid payment, I see no reason to take any action under the Contempt of Court's Act for the breach of the order, passed by this Court dated 6th February, 2012 in Contempt Case (Civil) No. 217 of 2010 by the opposite parties.

5. This Court appreciates painstakingly assistance rendered by the Senior Branch Manager, Oriental Insurance Company Limited, Ranchi and his Advocate Sri G.C. Jha. It appears that there is some delay or latches on the part of the Central Coalfields Limited in sending the claim papers of the petitioner-widow to Oriental Insurance Company Limited, but, looking to the positive approach of the Oriental Insurance Company Limited, the matter can be disposed of so easily.

6. In view of this payment, this contempt petition is hereby, dismissed.
