This is first bail application filed by the applicant under Section 438 of Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail.

The applicant is apprehending his arrest in connection with Crime No.173/2013 registered at P.S. Dehat, Shivpuri, District Shivpuri (M.P), for the offence punishable under Sections 498-A, 406, 323, 294/34 of IPC.

As per prosecution case, marriage of the complainant was solemnized with the son of the applicant about two years ago. After marriage applicant, mother-in-law, Jethani and Jeth started demanding cash and ornaments and committed cruelty. On 25.06.2013 at about 9:30 A.M., applicant beaten the complainant and taken away all the ornaments and turned out her from the matrimonial house.

Learned counsel for the applicant submits that applicant has falsely been implicated in the case. The complainant herself has insisted that the applicant should transfer the house situated at Shivpuri, therefore, a false complaint has been lodged. Co-accused have been granted anticipatory bail by the learned trial Court. Applicant is a 62 years old person. On these grounds, learned counsel for the applicant prays for grant of anticipatory bail.

Learned Public Prosecutor for the State has opposed the bail application.

2 M.Cr.C. No.7168/2013

Taking into consideration the allegation coupled with the fact that the co-accused have already been granted anticipatory bail by the trial Court, this application is allowed and it is directed that in the event of arrest, applicant shall be enlarged on bail on his furnishing a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rs. Fifty Thousand Only) with a surety bond in the like amount to the satisfaction of Arresting officer/competent Court. The applicant shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required and he will co-operate in the investigation. He shall further abide by the other conditions enumerated in sub-section (2) of Section 438 of Cr.P.C.

This order shall remain operative for a period of sixty days and during this period the applicant is free to move the regular bail application before the concerned Court.
