1] This is an application for anticipatory bail. Applicants herein are complainants in C. R. No.34 of 2013 of Dindori Police Station, District Nashik. It is a complaint under Sections 143, 147, 337, 323, 504, 506 read with Section 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

2] Initially a report was lodged by the accused persons which is registered as C.R. No. 34 of 2013. Thereafter the accused in C.R. No.34 of 2013 have filed a report which is registered as C.R. No.35 of 2013. Apparently, it is a case of fighting on account of dispute relating to immovable property.

3] Learned APP has tendered the investigation

papers for perusal of the Court. It seems to be a case of free fight. Any medical certificate showing injuries is not made a part of the case diary. In this situation, applicants have made out a case for the reliefs sought.

4] Hence, this application is allowed on following terms:-

(a) The applicant be released on bail in the event of arrest furtherance to C. R. No.35 of 2013 of Dindori Police Station, Nashik on furnishing P.R. Bond and solvent surety in a sum of Rs.5,000/- each.

(b) The applicant shall furnish within three days the postal address, cell phone number, landline number and name of contact person for sending message and/or information in the event the Investigating Officer requires personal attendance of the applicant in the matter.

(c) The applicant shall attend the concerned police station during 1st April, 2013 to 3rd April, 2013 between 2.00 to 5.00 p.m. and thereafter as and when called.
