PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner/A1, who is arrayed as accused, prays for the grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 of Cr.P.C. for the offences punishable under Sections 406 and 420, IPC, in Crime No.45 of 2013 on the file of the respondent police.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner, on the promise that she will secure an employment in nutritious meal scheme, has received money from various persons to the tune of Rs.15,50,000/- by promising to get employment in various department but failed to secure employment and also failed to repay the amount received.

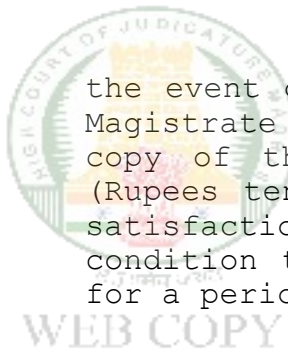
3.Learned Counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and she has not involved in this case.

4. Learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) submits that the investigation is going on. Hence, she prayed for the dismissal of the petition.

5. Heard the learned Counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate(Crl.Side) appearing for the State and also perused the entire materials available on record.

6. On consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and taking into consideration the contention of the learned Counsel for the petitioner that having lost of sum of Rs.1,00,000/- owing to wrong doing of other person, she has preferred a complaint in Crime No.106 of 2013 on the file of the Sellur Police Station, and the petitioner's complaint is earlier in point of time, this Court is of the view that the petitioner can be granted the relief prayed for.

7. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in



the event of her arrest or on her appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Madurai, within 15 days from the date of receipt of copy of the order and on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police, for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required.
