After hearing at length, learned counsel for the petitioner upon instruction submits that he does not want to press the writ petition.

Accordingly, the writ petition is dismissed as not being pressed. However, when the argument is advanced, I feel that some observation is required to be made. This order will not prevent and prejudice the petitioner before me to advance argument on any point orally before the learned revisional court, who will consider and deal with the same in accordance with law. If the practice and procedure permits to file affidavit, it would be open, if so advised, to file such affidavit. If the practice and procedure does not permit then obviously the petitioner is not entitled to file such affidavit.
