Mr. Gupta, learned counsel for the Petitioner, after arguing for some time, seeks permission to withdraw this Petition filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure with liberty to file a duly constituted Appeal against the Judgment dated 30.04.2014 passed in Private Complaint Case No. 55/2013 by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, East and North Sikkim at Gangtok. However, he submits that the Appeal now would be barred by limitation, therefore, some observations may be made in this regard.

The Petitioner was an accused in Private Complaint Case No. 55/2013. She has been convicted under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881 in the said complaint case by the Chief Judicial Magistrate. Presently she is in jail. After the conviction, as alleged,

the parties have entered into a compromise and on the

basis of said compromise, it has been settled that on

certain conditions the petitioner may be acquitted.

In view of the above, the Petitioner is granted

permission to withdraw this Petition with the liberty to file

a duly constituted Appeal before the concerned Sessions

Court with an Application for condonation of delay in

filing the Appeal as also an Application for compounding

the offence under Section 320 of the Code of Criminal

Procedure.

If such an Appeal is filed, the Application for

condonation of delay shall be considered sympathetically,

keeping in mind that the Petitioner is in jail and the

matter has already been compromised and the offence

under Section 138 of the N.I. Act is a compoundable one.

The Certified copy of the impugned Judgment passed

by the Chief Judicial Magistrate shall be returned back to

the counsel for the Petitioner.

With the above observations, the Petition stands

finally disposed of.
