The petitioner has been made accused for the offences under Sections 302/34 of the Indian Penal Code, in connection with Sidhgora P.S. Case No. 172 of 2013 corresponding to G.R. No. 3380 of 2013.

One unknown dead body was recovered and the case was instituted against unknown.

The impugned order shows that the petitioner and other co-accused were last seen along with the deceased.

It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that the said co-accused has been granted bail by order dated 10<sup>th</sup> April 2014 in B.A. No. 2597 of 2014, as it had transpired from the case diary that except the evidence of last seen, there was practically no other material. Learned counsel has accordingly, prayed for bail.

In the facts of this case, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner, Sanjay Lohar, on bail. Accordingly, the petitioner, named above, is directed to be released on bail, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand), with two sureties of the like amount each, to the satisfaction of Sri R.K. Singh, learned Judicial Magistrate 1<sup>st</sup> Class, Jamshedpur, or his successor, in connection with Sidhgora P.S. Case No. 172 of 2013 corresponding to G.R. No. 3380 of 2013.
