ORDER

H.G.RAMESH, J. (Oral):

Heard. This revision petition is by the husband. By the impugned order, the Family Court, Bangalore has awarded a maintenance of Rs.5,000/- per month to the respondent-wife. The relationship is not in dispute. The Family Court, on a detailed consideration of the evidence on record has found that the petitioner is residing with some other lady resulting in harassment to the respondent physically and mentally. It is not in dispute that the petitioner is working as a Police Sub-Inspector. In my opinion, the award of a maintenance of Rs.5,000/- per month cannot be said to be either erroneous or excessive warranting interference under the revisional jurisdiction of this Court under Sec.19(4) of the *Family Courts Act, 1984*. The revision petition is devoid of merit and is accordingly dismissed. In view

of dismissal of the revision petition, I.A. No.2/2011
filed for grant of interim stay also stands dismissed.

Revision petition dismissed.
