For having been found in possession of 13 vials of rexcof, the

petitioner has been in custody w.e.f. April 20, 2013. In the period of one

year of detention, only three witnesses of the prosecution could be examined

out of six cited. Petitioner was also found in possession of 130 tablets of

carisol containing a salt carisoprodol. The said salt is not a psychotropic

substance under NDPS Act.

Ignoring the said recovery, without expression of any opinion

on merits of the case; taking into consideration the period of detention

suffered; petitioner having not earlier been involved in any case; adopting

the reformative approach, the petitioner can be granted the concession of

bail.

The petition is allowed. Petitioner is ordered to be released on

bail on his furnishing bail bonds/ surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial

Court subject to the condition that he will not commit the similar offence of

which he is accused of during the pendency of the trial. He will also furnish

an undertaking before his release to be submitted in the Special Court that

in case he is found to commit similar offence again, the bail will be liable to

be cancelled.
