Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of the respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

A perusal of the case file reveals that when the grievance of the petitioners was not being redressed, they finally approached respondent No.2, by way of representation dated 17.12.2013 (Annexure P-9), but the same is also pending decision. Thus, it would be in the interest of justice, if respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide the representation of the petitioner within a reasonable time.

After going through the record of the case file and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, Forest Department Haryana-respondent No.2, is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitionerw raised vide their

representation dated 17.12.2013 (Annexure P-9) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the observations made above, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
