WP(C) 5014/2015 BEFORE THE HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE L.S. JAMIR

Heard Ms. D Deka, learned counsel for the petitioner. Also heard Mr. N Upadhyay, learned Government Advocate appearing for all the respondents.

The petitioner herein belongs to the OBC Category. The father of the petitioner died on 13.02.2008 while serving as a Tax Collector of Gagalmari Ashigarh Gaon P anchayat under Morigaon Zilla Parishad. As the family members of the petitioner were under going great hardship, the petitioner had applied for appointment on c ompassionate ground by an application dated 18.07.2008.

The case of the petitioner was considered and approved by the District Level Committee in its meeting held on 24.02.2011. Accordingly, the case of the petitioner was forwarded to the State Level Committee. As the State Level Committee has taken no further steps, the petitioner has filed the present writ petition.

Mr. N Upadhyay, learned Government Advocate appearing for all the respondents su bmits that the State Level Committee has considered the case of the petitioner, however, as she was found ineligible for appointment in Grade-III post, the case of the petitioner was rejected. However, Mr. N Upadhyay, learned Government Advocate appearing for all the respondents fairly submits that the case of the petitioner could have been considered by the State Level Committee for appointment to any Grade-IV post, as she is eligible for such post. He further submits that the State Level Committee is expected to sit again in the month of October, 2015. During that time if a direction is given by this Court, the case of the petitioner can be considered for appointment on compassionate ground to any Grade-IV po

In view of the submissions made by Mr. N Upadhyay, learned Government Advocate a ppearing for all the respondents, this writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the State Level Committee to consider the case of the petitioner again for appointment to any Grade-IV post as and when the State Level Committee sits in the month of October, 2015.

With the above observations and directions, this writ petition is disposed of.
