petitioner and Mr. Shekhar Sinha, learned counsel for the State,
assisted by Mr. Lalit Yadav, learned counsel for the informant.

The petitioner is an accused in connection with Mohanpur P.S.
Case No. 183 of 2015, corresponding to G.R. Case No. 894 of 2015,
registered for the offence punishable under sections 302, 120(B)/34
of the Indian Penal Code and 27 of the Arms Act.

It has been submitted by the learned senior counsel for the
petitioner that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the
present case and only on the suspicion that he was last seen with the
deceased, the petitioner has been roped in the present case.

It has further been submitted that in course of investigation,
only the confessional statement of the petitioner has been recorded
at paragraph 43 of the case diary and so far as paragraph 105 of the
case diary is concerned, the same contains the statement of one
Mahendra Das, who is said to have confessed to his killing the
deceased.

Learned counsel for the State opposes the prayer for bail and
submits that there is strong suspicion that the petitioner was involved
in commission of the offence as he was last seen with the deceased.

Regard being had to the aforesaid fact, the petitioner, named
above, is directed to be released on bail, on furnishing bail bond of
Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand only), with two sureties of the like amount
each to the satisfaction of Sri S.K. Singh, learned Judicial Magistrate,
Deoghar in connection with Mohanpur P.S. Case No. 183 of 2015,
corresponding to G.R. Case No. 894 of 2015.
