Prayer in the present petition is for quashing of FIR No.16 dated 23.4.2012, under Section 498-A IPC, registered at Police station Dhilwan, District Kapurthala (Annexure P-1) and further proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 20.9.2014 (Annexure P-2).

Vide order dated 20.4.2015, this Court has directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court to get their statements recorded and the learned Magistrate was directed to forward a report about the genuineness of the compromise to this Court.

In compliance of the order dated 20.4.2015, the parties have

appeared before the learned Magistrate on 20.5.2015 for getting their

statements recorded.

The report received from the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Kapurthala, reveals that the compromise effected between the

parties is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.

Learned State counsel does not dispute the aforesaid factual

position, rather admit the factum of compromise effected between the

parties.

Since the parties have entered into a compromise and

learned Magistrate has recorded their statements followed by his report,

continuation of the trial arising out from the impugned FIR and

consequential proceedings would be sheer abuse of the process of law

since chances of the conviction are bleak.

Keeping in view the factum of compromise effected between

the parties dated 20.9.2014 and the law laid down by this Court in the

case of Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another

2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 (P & H), this petition is accepted and FIR No.16

dated 23.4.2012, under Section 498-A IPC, registered at Police station

Dhilwan, District Kapurthala and the consequential proceedings arising

therefrom are hereby quashed.
