

**S.B. CRIMINAL REVISION PETITION No.787/2015  
&  
S.B. CRIMINAL MISC. STAY PETITION No.2889/2015  
Inderpal & Ors. vs. State of Rajasthan & Anr.**

**HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE RAGHUVENDRA S. RATHORE**

At the outset, the learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that he does not press the criminal revision petition challenging the order dated 22.5.2015. However, he has submitted that looking to the fact that cognizance u/s 193 Cr.P.C. has been taken against petitioners No. 1 and 2 whereas against petitioners No. 3 to 9 is with the aid of section 149 IPC.

Therefore, he has submitted that as the petitioners are ready and willing to appear before the trial court on the next date i.e. 8.7.2015, appropriate indulgence may be granted to them for appearance before the trial court and they shall thereafter regularly attend the hearing of the case.

In view of the above, revision petition as also the stay application No.2889/2015 is disposed of with the direction to the petitioners to appear before the trial court on 8.7.2015 and furnish the bail bonds to the satisfaction of it. In case the petitioners fail to do so, the authorities concern shall be free to execute the order passed by the trial court on 22.5.2015.
