The petitioners are the truck operators who have a grouse against respondent No.5- Union as they are threatening to interfere in their work through their musclemen. The petitioners have invoked Article 21 of the Constitution of India and prayed that their life and liberty be protected besides ensuring smooth operation of their business as provided in Article 19(1)(g) of the Constitution of India. After notice, respondents No.1 to 4 have filed reply but respondent No.5 has not filed reply despite repeated opportunities. In fact no one is appearing on behalf of respondent No.5 to contest this petition.

Counsel for the petitioners has submitted that he would be satisfied if a direction is issued to respondent No.3 to look into their grievance in case their life and liberty is threatened by respondent No.5 and take appropriate action against them.

Counsel for the State has submitted that if any such application is filed to respondent No.3, the s

ame shall be taken to its logical end and appropriate order shall be passed.

In view of the respective stand taken by counsel for the parties, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3 in particular and to other respondents in general to ensure the protection of life and liberty of the members of petitioners No.1 and 2 if they are threatened, as alleged, by respondent No.5 at any point of time, on account of business rivalry.

With these observations, the present petition is hereby disposed of.
